Welcome to Worship!

This weekend, we continue our worship series on “Lord, Increase Our Faith!” Even though we're disciples of Jesus, we still need Jesus to teach us how to pray, to learn to claim in prayer what he wants for us rather than what we want from him. But learning how to pray isn't like other learning. Once we know how to write our name, tie our shoes, or ride a bike, the learning is done - either we know how to do these things or we don't. Prayer, on the other hand, isn't something we learn to do once and then know how to do correctly for the rest of our lives. Instead, learning to pray consists of a lifetime of persistence and struggle. And when we struggle with God in prayer, it's an indication that everything is right. Struggle is part of the very nature of prayer and is at the heart of the blessings it brings.

Worship Notes

It is our hope and prayer that the message you hear today from God's Word will fill your heart with the peace that only God can offer and the joy we have in knowing that Jesus Christ is our Savior from sin.

Rather, we desire to faithfully carry out the teaching of Scripture and further explore God's Word with you in the hope that we may eventually enjoy such “communion fellowship” together. For patience and perseverance in this life, that we may not lose the hope of heaven as we await your return, hear our prayer, O Lord.






