

ADVENT GATHERING RITE

M: In the name of the Father and of the Son $\ \ \ \ \ \ \ \$ and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

- **M:** Beloved in the Lord: let us draw near with a true heart and confess our sins to God our Father, asking him in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ to grant us forgiveness.
- C: Holy and merciful Father, I confess that I am by nature sinful and that I have disobeyed you in my thoughts, words, and actions. I have done what is evil and failed to do what is good. For this I deserve your punishment both now and in eternity. But I am truly sorry for my sins, and trusting in my Savior Jesus Christ, I pray: Lord, have mercy on me, a sinner.

(sung) I lay in fetters, groaning,
You come to set me free;
I stood, my shame bemoaning,
You come to honor me;
A glory you do give me,
A treasure safe on high,
That will not fail or leave me
As earthly riches fly.

M: God, our heavenly Father, has been merciful to us and has given his only Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Therefore, as a called servant of Christ and by his authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son 🖶 and of the Holy Spirit.

LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT WREATH

M: We light one Advent candle and remember Jesus, the One who is coming again. He will come at the end of time to gather together all his people, both the living and the dead.

C: We remember Jesus, who will come at a day and hour unknown to his creation.

M: We hear his call to watch.

C: We light one Advent candle as a sign of our watchfulness and waiting.

M: Come, Lord Jesus, and dwell among us.

C: Through your Word and Spirit may our souls be blessed.

The first Advent candle is lit during the sung response.

A terror to his foes,

A light of consolations,

And blessed hope to those

Who love the Lord's appearing.

O glorious Sun, now come,

THE WORD+

First Lesson

Genesis 6:1-3, 5-14, 17-22

In the waters of the flood, God destroyed mankind but saved Noah and his family.

When men began to increase in number on the earth and daughters were born to them, the sons of God saw that the daughters of men were beautiful, and they married any of them they chose. Then the LORD said, "My Spirit will not contend with man forever, for he is mortal; his days will be a hundred and twenty years."

The LORD saw how great man's wickedness on the earth had become, and that every inclination of the thoughts of his heart was only evil all the time. The LORD was grieved that he had made man on the earth, and his heart was filled with pain. So the LORD said, "I will wipe mankind, whom I have created, from the face of the earth – men and animals, and creatures that move along the ground, and birds of the air – for I am grieved that I have made them." But Noah found favor in the eyes of the LORD.

This is the account of Noah.

Noah was a righteous man, blameless among the people of his time, and he walked with God. Noah had three sons: Shem, Ham and Japheth.

Now the earth was corrupt in God's sight and was full of violence. God saw how corrupt the earth had become, for all the people on earth had corrupted their ways. So God said to Noah, "I am going to put an end to all people, for the earth is filled with violence because of them. I am surely going to destroy both them and the earth. So make yourself an ark of cypress wood; make rooms in it and coat it with pitch inside and out. I am going to bring floodwaters on the earth to destroy all life under the heavens, every creature that has the breath of life in it. Everything on earth will perish. But I will establish my covenant with you, and you will enter the ark – you and your sons and your wife and your sons' wives with you. You are to bring into the ark two of all living creatures, male and female, to keep them alive with you. Two of every kind of bird, of every kind of animal and of every kind of creature that moves along the ground will come to you to be kept alive. You are to take every kind of food that is to be eaten and store it away as food for you and for them."

Noah did everything just as God commanded him.

^{*}Lectionary: A lectionary is the list of readings for a given Sunday or festival of the church year. Public reading of the Scriptures has always been an important part of worship. Two lessons were read in the Jewish synagogue: one from the law and one from the prophets. Along with these lessons, the early Christians also began to read from the Gospels and the letters of the apostles, now known as *epistles*. The lectionary (series of readings) used by many Lutheran churches is based on a three-year cycle. The First Lesson comes from the Old Testament (except during the Easter season, when it is from Acts) and is generally chosen to match the emphasis of the Gospel. The Second Lesson comes from a New Testament epistle. Each year, one of the Synoptic Gospels (Matthew, Mark, or Luke) serves as the basis for the Gospel, with readings from John used during the Easter season in all three years.

It saves you by the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has gone into heaven and is at God's right hand – with angels, authorities and powers in submission to him.

Gospel Mark 13:32-37

In keeping watch, we prepare for the time when God will come in judgment and salvation.

"No one knows about that day or hour, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. Be on guard! Be alert! You do not know when that time will come. It's like a man going away: He leaves his house and puts his servants in charge, each with his assigned task, and tells the one at the door to keep watch.

"Therefore keep watch because you do not know when the owner of the house will come back – whether in the evening, or at midnight, or when the rooster crows, or at dawn. If he comes suddenly, do not let him find you sleeping. What I say to you, I say to everyone: 'Watch!' "


Savior of the nations, come; virgin's Son, make here your home. Marvel now, O heav'n and earth, that the Lord chose such a birth.

For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours now and forever. Amen.






